The purpose of this meeting is to provide the community with an opportunity to learn about the proposed project and allow an open discussion of any views and comments concerning the proposed improvements. A Q&A session will immediately follow the presentation.

The purpose of this project is to replace the existing bridge, prioritizing improved safety and durability for roadway users.

Right-of-way impacts are associated with this project. Route 189 will be closed to pedestrian and vehicular traffic for the duration of construction. The proposed detour is approximately 24 miles using state routes.

Construction is anticipated to begin in fall 2026. The estimated cost of this project is approximately \$2.3 million, with 80 % federal funds and 20% state funds.
