The purpose of this meeting is to provide the community with an opportunity to learn about the proposed project and allow an open discussion of any views and comments concerning the proposed improvements. A Q&A session will immediately follow the presentation.

This replacement will create a new service life for this crossing by designing a structure that meets all current design and safety standards.

The right-of-way impacts associated with the proposed improvements are on private property and will consist of temporary construction easements for access, grading, and water handling, and a slope easement. Additionally, a drainage right-of-way will be required for the proposed drainage system.

Construction is anticipated to begin in 2027. The estimated construction cost for this project is approximately \$4 million with 80% federal funds and 20% state funds.
