## AMENDED STATEMENT OF CHARGES

Pursuant to the General Statutes of Connecticut, §§19a-10 and 19a-14, the Department of Public Health (hereinafter "the Department") brings the following charges against Paul Willette, M.D.:

- Paul Willette of Lady Lake, Florida (hereinafter "respondent") is the holder of Connecticut license number 047063 to practice medicine and surgery.
- 2. On or around April 10, 2017, the New Mexico Medical Board revoked respondent's New Mexico license to practice medicine pursuant to a Decision and Order of the Board in Case No. 2016-040 ("New Mexico Decision").
- 3. The New Mexico Decision was based, in part, upon findings that respondent failed to provide appropriate patient care, failed to maintain adequate patient records and engaged in disruptive behavior while practicing as a physician in New Mexico.
- 4. On or about September 13, 2018, the Massachusetts Board of Registration in Medicine revoked respondent's right to renew his Massachusetts license to practice medicine in Adjudicatory Case No. 2017-035 based upon the New Mexico Decision.
- On or about October 25, 2016, the Colorado Medical Board summarily suspended respondent's Colorado license to practice medicine because respondent had failed to comply with a prior order that respondent complete an evaluation with the Colorado Physician Health Program.
- On or about February 12, 2019, the State of Maine, Board of Licensure in Medicine, denied the 6. respondent's ability to renew his Maine license to practice medicine pursuant to a Decision and Order in Complaint No. CR17-139 as a result of respondent's prior discipline in other states and premised upon his conduct as found in those actions, as well as Maine's finding that respondent engaged in fraud in seeking to obtain renewal of his license in Maine, in part by intentionally distorting the nature and status of allegations against him in other states.
- The above-described facts constitute grounds for disciplinary action pursuant to the General Statutes of Connecticut, §§19a-17(f) and/or 20-13c, including, but not limited to, §20-13c(4) and/or §20-13c(6).

THEREFORE, the Department prays that:

The Connecticut Medical Examining Board, as authorized in §§19a-17 and 20-13c, revoke or order other disciplinary action against the Connecticut medical license of Paul Willette as it deems appropriate and consistent with law.
