1. Call to Order

Alicea Charamut called the meeting to order at 1:39 and asked everyone to introduce themselves.

2. Approval of draft 11/15/2022 Minutes

4. Water Plan Updates

a. Annual Report Summaries

Virginia de Lima described the process underway for compiling a draft annual report for the WPC to submit to the legislature. There was a discussion of how information submitted to the work group has been compiled and how the information will be made available online. See:

There was further discussion of the process for compiling the report and it was noted that the time spent developing this process will allow future reports to be prepared more quickly.

Virginia de Lima also mentioned the USGS data needs work group and said its next meeting will be in January.

b. Water Planning Council Update

Alicea Charamut said the WPC approved the slate of WPCAG members whose terms begin in January and asked Bruce Wittchen to post a link to the <u>WPCAG procedural rules</u> that she will send him.

5. WPCAG Work Groups

a. Watershed Lands Work Group

Karen Burnaska provided an overview of the group's work regarding water resources information expected when legislators request land conveyances. She notes the interest in advancing this work but said that it cannot be done on behalf of the WPC or WPCAG. She also mentioned recent interest in the process for state agency land transfers.

Karen mentioned possible legislative initiatives for the 2023 session including training for inland wetland commission members, increased staffing at DEEP, and notifications of solar installations within public water supply watersheds. She also mentioned <u>DPH's</u> upcoming declaratory ruling hearing regarding the <u>MDC</u> and Colebrook Reservoir.

Karen noted that there will be no remote access and that the MDC has requested a change in the wording of the question being asked. Karen added that the work group will continue meeting quarterly in 2023.

Alicea Charamut said there are no reports for the other listed groups but the conservation rates work group meeting will be scheduled after January 1.

6. Old Business

a. Water Utility Coordinating Committee (WUCC) update

Dan Lawrence said there have been some difficulties in scheduling WUCC meetings, but they are wrapping up the projects they presented to this group earlier this year. There was a discussion of how they will improve coordination between meetings of the regional WUCCs and of the WUCC implementation group. She also mentioned an upcoming Greenwich YWCA presentation on climate justice in CT. Carol Haskins said the Institute for American Indian Studies in Washington, CT has a temporary exhibit on Water is Life.
