1. Call to Order

Co-chair Alicea Charamut called the meeting to order at 1:33 and everyone introduced themselves. Alicia noted the passing of long-time WPCAG member Margaret Miner, and played a video of <u>Senator Murphy's testimonial</u> to Margaret on the senate floor. Others spoke of their memories of Margaret

2. Approval of draft 4/16/2024 Minutes

A motion was made and seconded to approve the <u>draft 4/16/2024 minutes</u> and the motion was approved unanimously, with Darryl Newman and Nicole Deziel abstaining because they had not attended the meeting.

3. Legislative Recap

Alicea Charamut said language that would have undermined the <u>CT Environmental Protection Act</u> and wetlands protections did not pass in affordable housing bill <u>HB 5475</u>, *An Act Concerning The Development Of Housing And Challenges To Certain Decisions Of Municipal Agencies*.

Alicea noted that such language, specific transportation projects, passed in budget implementer bill HB 5523 (PA 24-81), An Act Concerning Allocations Of Federal American Rescue Plan Act Funds And Provisions Related To General Government, Human Services, Education And The Biennium Ending June 30, 2025 (beginning with Sec. 127). She said it was intended to apply only to federal American Rescue Plan Act-funded projects but was worded too broadly. There will be an attempt to correct that.

Alicea Charamut said <u>HB 5004</u>, *An Act Concerning The Implementation Of Certain Climate Change Measures*, did not pass but there is talk of bringing it up in special session. Another bill that died was <u>HB 5218</u>, *An Act Concerning The Establishment Of Riparian Buffers And Revision Of Certain Inland Wetlands Provisions*.

Alicea mentioned that <u>HB 5170</u>, *An Act Concerning Training For Members And Employees Of Inland Wetlands Agencies*, did not pass. She asked about water-oriented bills that utilities were following. Nicoletta Blevins said there were not many others, but mentioned <u>SB 192</u> (PA 24-94), *AN ACT CONCERNING DAM SAFETY*. She can send the list of bills she followed.

4. Old Business

- a. WPC and work group updates
 - WPC meeting

Alicea Charamut said the WPC will cancel or postpone its 6/4 meeting.

• Nominating Committee

There was no update.

- USGS Data Collection Work Group
 - final <u>draft Report on the Evaluation of the USGS Data Collection Programs</u>

There was no update and it was noted that the group's report is linked on the agenda.

Watershed Lands Work Group

Alicea said the group will meet 6/14.

Source Water Protection Work Group

Alicea said the group canceled the meeting scheduled for this morning and Kim Czapla said the group expects to complete a draft by the end of the summer.

Conservation Pricing and Rate Recovery Analysis Work Group

Alicea said a meeting will be scheduled.

• Outreach & Education Work Group

Iris Kaminski said the group is planning a Source Water Protection Week event in September, which could be a collaboration with the Source Water Protection Work Group or Watershed Lands Work Group. Alicea asked if the WPC's most recent annual report is available on the water website and Kim Czapla placed a link in chat.

Kim said this work group discussed a possible clean water stewardship program, in which clean water stewards would assist in implementing the state water plan. Some partners are already implementing parts of the plan but without getting credit for it. She provided further background.

b. Other old business

Website changes

Becca Dahl described the work of DEEP and OPM staff, highlighting the goal of making information available in a consistent and accessible way. She also mentioned the upcoming website migration. Ali Hibbard said she had met with state's contractor to clean up the site and prepare for migration.

• Water Utility Coordinating Committee (WUCC) update

Lisette Stone said there is no update, but they are reworking the process and the WUCCs are meeting.

Interagency Drought Work Group

Becca Dahl said the group did not meet this month but intends to meet in June. She described work at the staff level to prepare a tabletop exercise to test the drought plan. She added that it is intended to be an all-hands-on-deck exercise.

5. New Business

Alicea Charamut said Saturday is <u>World Fish Migration Day</u> and mentioned events planned at the Farmington River. She also recommended people provide notices of water-related activities to the WPC.

6. Public Comment

Carol Haskins mentioned the efforts of DPH, DEEP, and the health district in response to the discovery of trichloroethylene in some private wells in her watershed. DEEP is determining the source and she noted the area is far from the nearest public water system.

Virginia de Lima asked how to dispose of PFAS and Steve Woltornist and Tom Tyler described options for contaminated water filters and containers of Scotchgard, respectively. Alicea Charamut not that SB 292 (PA 24-59), *An Act Concerning The Use Of Pfas In Certain Products*, passed this session.
